"Implementing an Earned Value Management System"

Over the past decade the federal government pronouncements and policies have started moving toward a requirement to apply Earned Value Management (EVM) to federally funded contracts.

This presentation begins by explaining why any federal government contractor or subcontractor, even a small company, could be faced with the requirement to implement an EVM System (EVMS). It then identifies the components for full EVMS implementation and provides an explanation of an Earned Value Management system. The main body of the presentation takes the audience through the entire EVMS implementation process beginning with the decision to implement, through planning and deploying the system, preparing for the validation/compliance review and concluding with a discussion of surveillance.
